

12 easy steps to register in Scholar for the WHO Vaccination coverage survey Scholar Module 1 Community



1. Go to <http://cgscholar.com>. This is the URL (address) of the Scholar web site, where you will work in this course.

We recommend that you bookmark the site to make it easy to return to it.

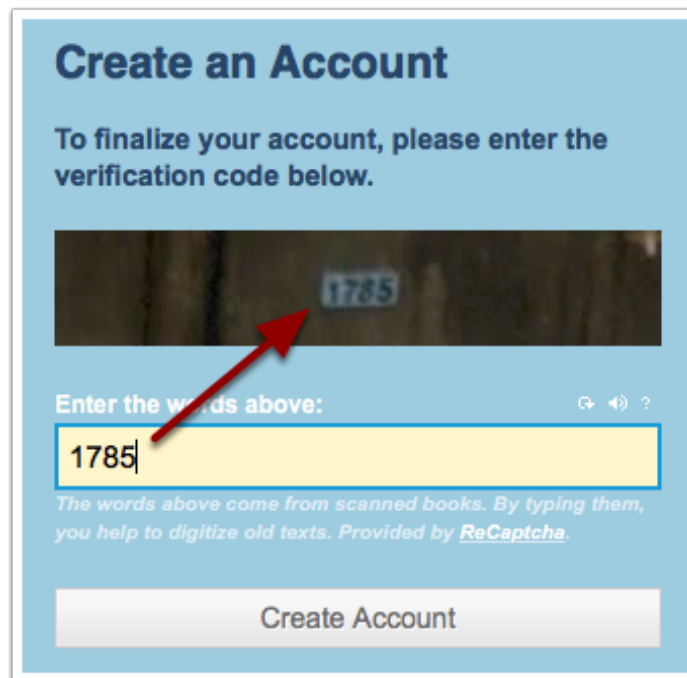

3. Prove that you are not a robot.

Retype the words or numbers that appear in the image into the yellow box. Then click on **Create Account**. This step is necessary to keep spammers and robots out of Scholar.

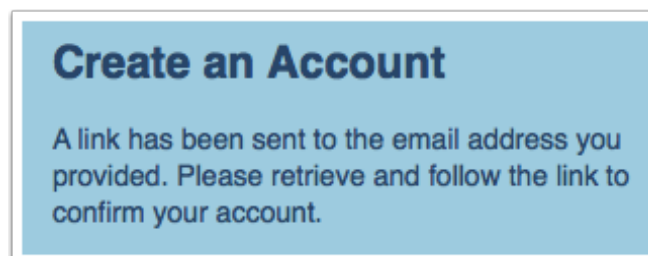

4. A link has been sent to the email address you provide.

You're almost there! You will now need to go to your e-mail client and check for a message received from Scholar. This step is necessary to ensure that you have provided a working email address and have access to the email account.



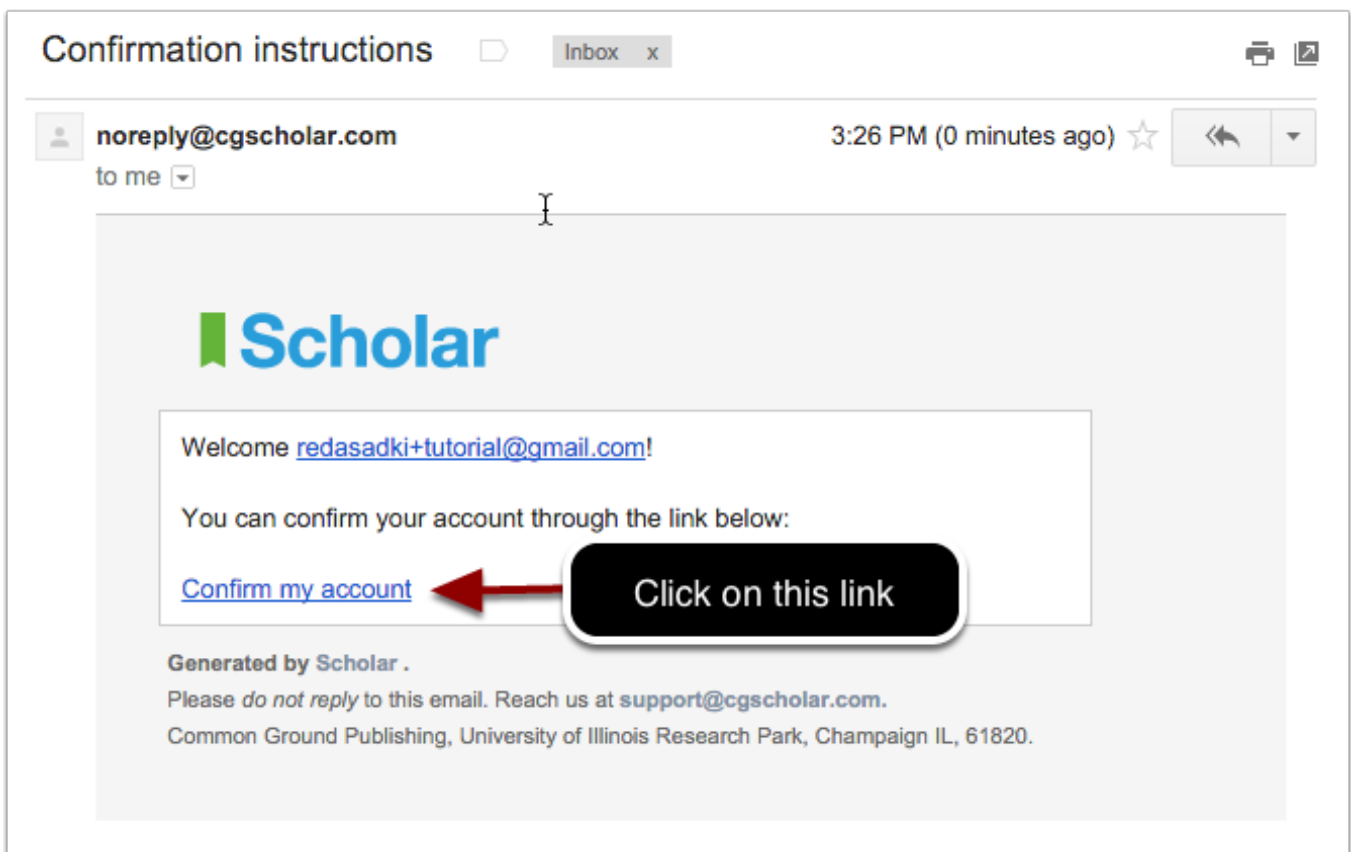

5. Find the confirmation instructions from Scholar in your email account

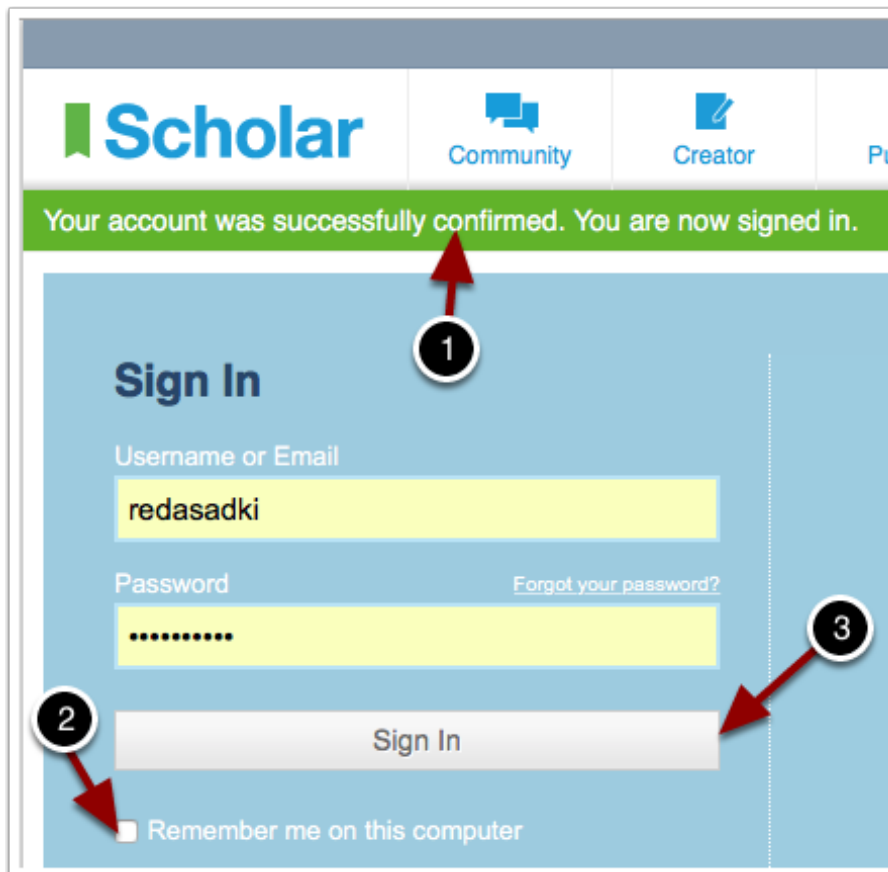
You should see a new message in your inbox. The message subject or title is "Confirmation instructions" and the sender is noreply@cgscholar.com. If you do not immediately see the message, check your Spam or Junk mail folders. If the message is there, please ensure that you whitelist or other indicate that messages from noreply@cgscholar.com are **not** spam, and should appear directly in your inbox.

Once you have found the message, open it. Click on the link titled **Confirm my account**. This should open your browser again.



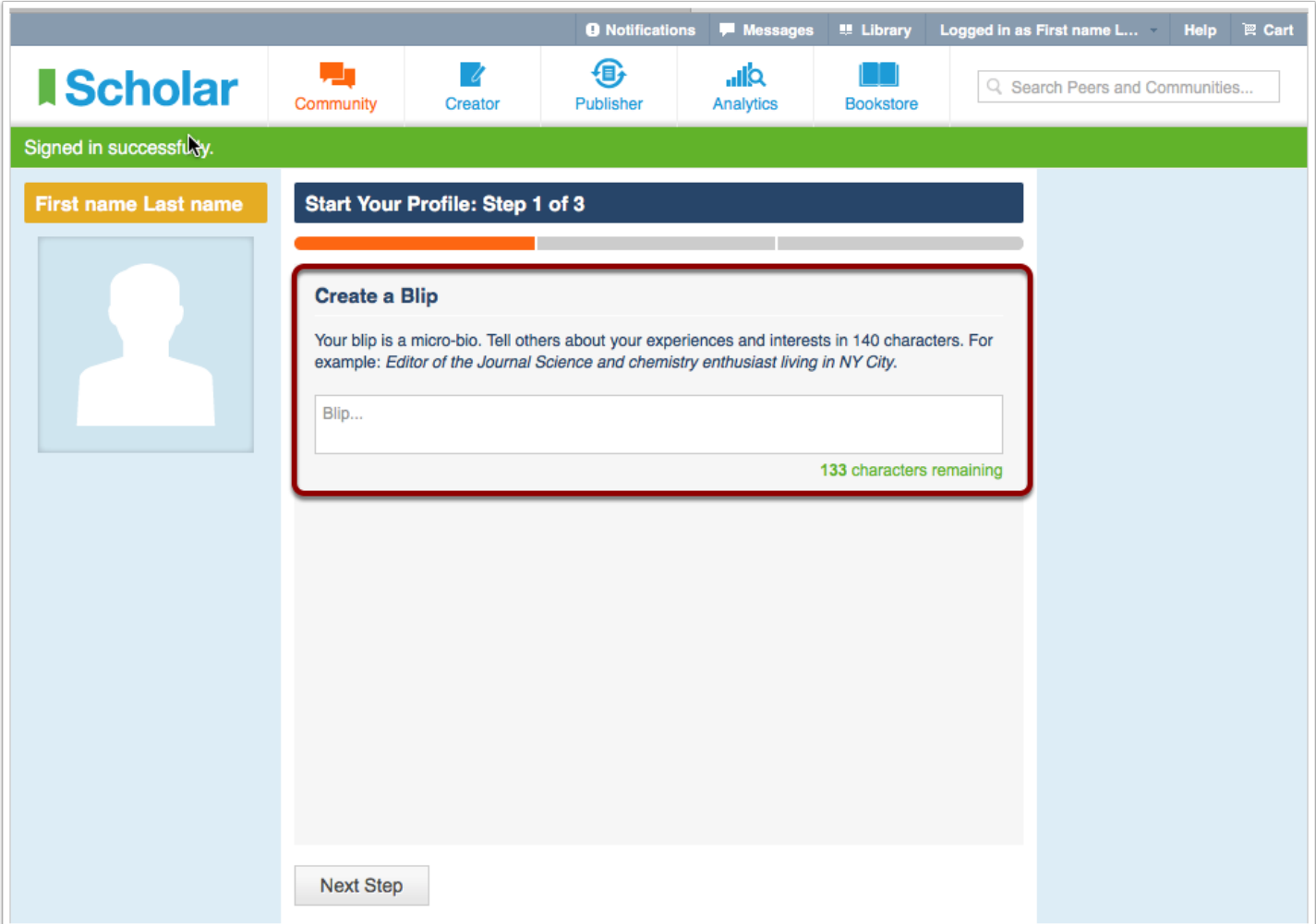
6. Your account was successfully confirmed.

You should see a green bar with the message "Your account was successfully confirmed. You are now signed in." In fact, you will need to fill in your Username and Password and click on "Sign In" in order to complete this step. Unless you are using a shared or public computer, you may wish to check the checkbox "Remember me on this computer" before clicking the Sign In button.



7. Start your profile (Step 1 of 3)

There are three more steps to create your profile. The first step is to create a "blip", a micro-bio. Introduce yourself in 140 characters. Once you are done, click on the **Next Step** button at the bottom of the screen.

8. Connect with Peers & Communities (Step 2 of 3)

This is an optional step. You may skip to Step 3.

If you see any Communities that are of interest to you, click on the **Request To Join** button that appears next to the Community name. If the Community is not Open, your request will need be approved by a Community administrator, who check regularly for new requests.

You may also search for individuals whom you know to be participating in the course. For example, search for "Reda Sadki" and click on the **Add to Peers** button. This will connect you to Reda Sadki,

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member of the #DigitalScholar course team, so that you are able to access his Profile and view his Activity in Scholar. Other course team members are Bill Cope and Catherine Russ.

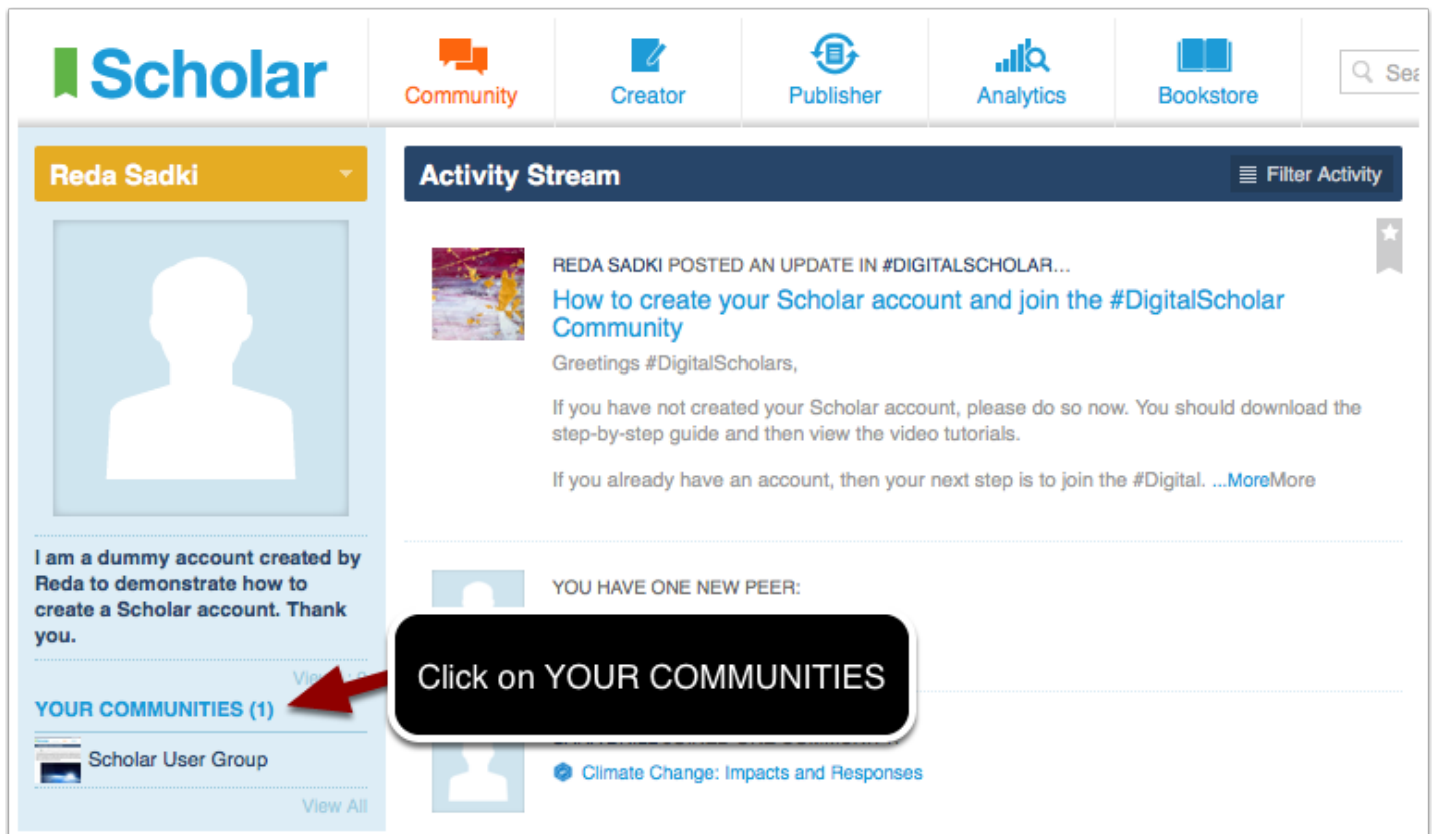

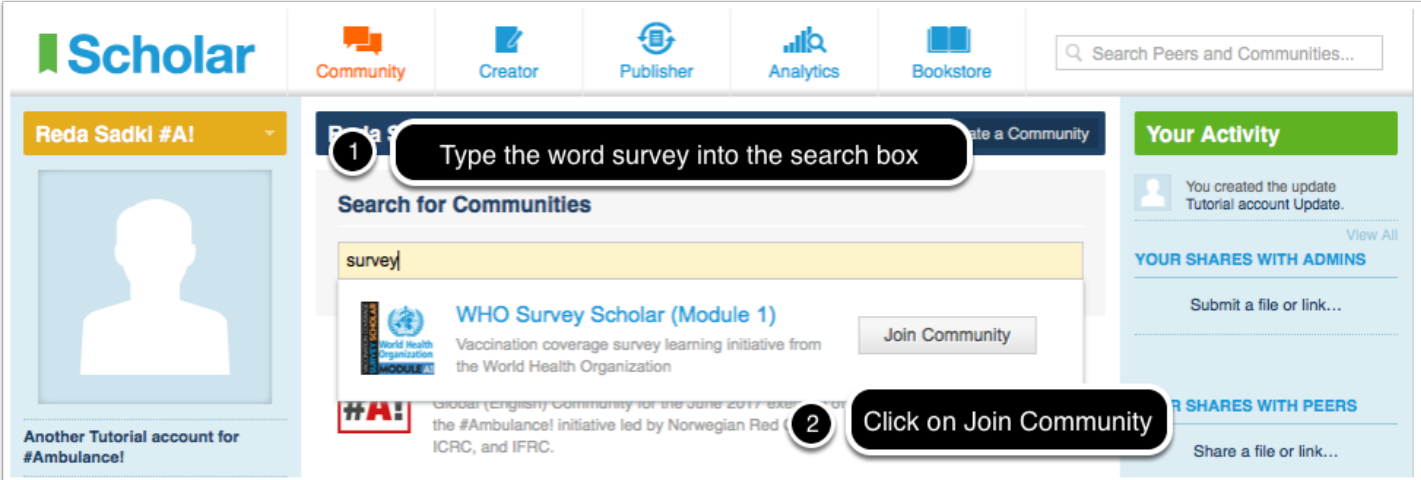

11. Type the word 'survey' (without the quotes) into the Communities search box. You should see the WHO Survey Scholar Module 1 Community. Click on the Join Community button.
